Extracts from Regulations for Registration of Postal Packets. (For full Regulations see Post Office Guide.)

#### GENERAL.

L. No compensation is paid in respect of a Postal Packet in which any prohibited article is enclosed.

II. No compensation is paid for consequential

damage.

III. The decision of the Postmaster-General upon any claim for compensation is final.

IV. No legal liability attaches to the Pest master-General in respect of the issue of this Certificate

X. The Postmaster-General does not in any case may more than the actual value of the article lost or the amount of the damage sustained.

### IMPERIAL AND FOREIGN.

XI. No claim for compensation can be entertained except in case of entire loss; and the payment made for a lost packet in no circumstances exceeds 22.

Packets sent to many condities abroad can be insured against loss or damage. For Registration and insurance Regulations see Post Office Guide.
