below Banskis. The river  
was low so we crawled  
down till we reached a  
rock close beside the main  
wash of the water.

I can't describe it,  
the river was like some  
force living thing, a  
thin mist rose from the  
pool below a hang like  
smoke.

The place was  
full of salmon travelling  
up stream, a they were  
leaping continually, clean  
out of the water as they  
tried to get up the falls.

All round the hills  
came down close, a few  
sheer rock, crossed with  
silver birches, a then above  
naked rock a heather, the  
clouds sweeping over the

topmost points. The river  
is coloured deep gold &  
clear as crystal.

Rain is needed terribly,  
& today it is trying it's  
best & is much colder.

There are lots of gulls about  
though we are fifty miles  
inland.
